In Maths the children will be working on:

- Number, place value and calculation, using all 4 operations and problem solving.
- Measurement, including conversions, area and perimeter.
- Geometry with 2d and 3d shapes, including angles and parts of a circle.
- Statistics - pie charts and line graphs and finding the mean.
- Using & applying their knowledge.



In Science the children will be learning about 'Light' and exploring:

- How light travels
- How humans see
- How we see colour
- Manipulating shadows

Through a range of cross curricular activities incorporating **History and Geography**, we will be exploring the key question:

How was Britain able to stand firm against the German threat?

In **Art** lessons, we will be exploring silhouette and perspective, and creating cityscapes.

In **Music** lessons, we will be exploring the most popular UK music from WW2, and performing some well-known songs from the era.
